# Next Door Joins On the Table conversation



High-engaging conversations dominated the On the Table breakfast session at Next Door's 29th Street campus.

Conversation that fuels change – that was the goal of a recent, region-wide forum called On the Table from the Greater Milwaukee Foundation. On Tuesday, October 17th, more than 5,000 people came together all over the Milwaukee area for mealtime conversations and discussed the issues our community faces and the individual/collective measures we can take to create change.

Next Door served as a "Super Host" for the event and held two diverse gatherings a breakfast at our 29th Street campus and a lunch at our Capitol Drive building. We welcomed more than 100 guests, including Milwaukee Alderman Russell Stamper and Alderman Cavalier Johnson. We also had early childhood experts from University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and Marquette University,

plus Next Door donors, volunteers, staff members and parents.

Our conversations focused on issues related to poverty, and how the benefits of investing in high quality early childhood education can help break that cycle for children and families living in Milwaukee's central city.

During the event, we asked participants to come up with one action goal they can take over the next month to help build a stronger community. We will be following up with each individual to learn about their progress and get program feedback.

It is our hope that this On the Table experience fosters new relationships, generates ideas and ignites action to move Milwaukee forward!
