Letter from the President

It's a busy summer at Next Door as we prepare a comprehensive plan to address our students' transition back to 100% in-person learning in the fall.

We've developed an Accelerating Equity plan to address the greater needs expected from our students and families across our early childhood education and prenatal services programming. In late June, we implemented a few early initiatives like a summer school program. We're also piloting a new team of volunteer tutors called "Accelerators" who are working one-on-one with students. Learn more about these efforts inside.

I'm also excited to share news of the innovative work happening at Next Door like virtual reality programming. In addition, students at our 29th Street campus are expanding their creativity and physical exercise on beautiful, new playgrounds this summer - check out the back page for a photo!

We're investing in our staff, too, with an Aspiring Leaders program in partnership with Marquette University. We graduated our first class of participants in June and their leadership potential is clear!

We're grateful for the community generosity for Next Door with two major recent events supporting our critical early childhood education work. More than 400 people participated in our Virtual Walk for Children in May. We just wrapped up our Books for Kids 30th birthday celebration with more than 40 book drives hosted by the community. I want to thank our community supporters – and the Next Door team – for being such devoted champions for our children and families, and helping Next Door continue doing the most important work in Milwaukee today!

Next Door named 2021 Top Workplaces by Journal Sentinel

We're proud to announce another high-profile workplace award for Next Door! In May of this year, the Journal Sentinel named Next Door a Top Workplaces based on feedback from our annual employee survey. As part of the honor, the newspaper recognized Next Door in a virtual ceremony and published a story featuring the work of Next Door in our community and positive feedback from our employee survey.

We've seen a significant improvement in our employee turnover rate from 32% in 2018 to 16% in 2020. 16% is well below the typical average of 30 to 35% in early childhood organizations nationwide. In 2020, Next Door received the Best Places to Work award from Milwaukee Business Journal.

Transitioning back to school: Next Door's Accelerating Equity Plan

After an unprecedented past year, we recognize the upcoming school year needs to be more than business as usual at Next Door. Our students missed out on critical in-person learning experiences with their teachers and peers, and may have experienced serious trauma at home due to stresses tied to the pandemic.

Guided by our Accelerating Equity plan, we will return this fall with 100% in-person learning for more than 1,300 students across our

center-based, home-based and partnership programming. The plan maintains our high quality early childhood education with enhanced academic and social-emotional support for students. We will provide additional transitional support for parents and staff, too. We've already started implementing parts of the plan this summer and examples are featured below.

Summer School

- K4 students
- Daily literacy, writing and math instruction
- Daily enrichment activities like STEM, arts, sensory play and library visits
- 3 Calm Classroom mindfulness sessions daily







Accelerators

- 12 volunteers onsite 2-5 days/week
- One-on-one tutoring for K4 and K5 students
- Supporting children with language, literacy, math and enrichment activities
- Includes partnership with City of Milwaukee's Earn & Learn program and Literacy's Lab's Leading Men Fellowship







Virtual Reality

- K5 students
- Broadening student horizons with new life experiences
- Topics include world travel, habitat exploration and transportation
- Building vocabulary and cognition skills
- Experiences expanded upon with journaling, art, conversation and more
