Free vaccine!

You do not need an ID, proof of residency, or health insurance.**

Do you have health insurance that covers your child offered to you through your (or your spouse's) employer?

- If recommended vaccines are covered
- How much you may need to pay, if anything
- Where you can get your child's vaccines near you

Your child is eligible for the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program!

To find a VFC provider or for questions about the VFC program, ask your doctor, contact your state or local health department, or call 1-800-CDC-INFO (1-800-232-4636) for help in English and Spanish.

Get vaccines for free at a Vaccines for Children (VFC) provider.

While there is no charge for the vaccine, there may be other costs associated with the visit. Example:

- A fee to give each shot, but you cannot be denied a vaccine if you are unable to pay.
- A copay for the office visit.
- Charges for non-vaccine services, like an eye exam or blood test.

Does your health insurance cover your child's vaccines?

Get your vaccines at a location recommended by your health insurance company.

Be sure to call ahead to verify any costs and bring your health insurance card.

*Underinsured means your child has health insurance, but it doesn't cover some or all vaccines or covers vaccines but has a fixed dollar limit for vaccines.

**An administration fee can be charged for COVID-19 vaccines, but you can not be denied a vaccine if you are unable to pay the administration fee.
